NEASC GRANTS CANTERBURY SCHOOL CONTINUED ACCREDITATION FOLLOWING VISITING COMMITTEE REPORT

The New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) has voted to grant Canterbury School Continued Accreditation following review of the School's Self-Study Report, Visiting Committee Report, and Canterbury's response letter. The NEASC works to establish and maintain high standards for all levels of education and inspire institutional commitment to the integrity of their program. The Accreditation Process is structured in a ten-year cycle during which Canterbury undergoes a Follow-up process at the 2 and 5-year marks to ensure compliance with the Committee's recommendations. As reported by the NEASC, Canterbury's Continued Accreditation attests to substantial compliance with established qualitative standards, integrity in statements to the public describing the School's program, the School's commitment to improvement, and sufficiency of School resources. It is within a spirit of continued excellence that Canterbury completed the NEASC Self-Study Report and the Visiting Committee evaluation to receive the Committee's Continued Accreditation.
